Munster Technological University (MTU) is a multi-campus technological university with 6 campuses located in the South West of Ireland. MTU was established in January 2021 from a merger between the Cork Institute of Technology and the Institute of Technology Tralee. MTU brings together a long proud heritage of excellence in higher education in Ireland, to create a new and exciting global university centred on delivering the very best quality education for the student, the region and the wider world.

Small class sizes, an excellent staff student ratio and a strong emphasis on learning through practical application, combine to make an interactive dynamic learning environment. With a community of over 18,000 students and 2000 staff, consisting of a diverse mix of home and international students, MTU guarantees a diverse learning environment and a warm welcome.

MTU's 6 campuses are located across the South West of Ireland, 4 of which are located in and around Cork City, the 2nd largest city in Ireland and there are 2 campuses in Tralee, the administrative capital of County Kerry, Ireland's most popular tourist region.

Courses available include Bachelor & Masters degrees in Business, Engineering, Science, Computing, Nursing, Humanities, Art and Music. The university offers the full range of higher education qualifications, including Bachelor degrees and post-graduate Masters and PhD degrees. The MTU has a very well developed 'ladder' structure to enable students to progress through the different levels of qualifications.

KERRY CAMPUSES

Two of MTU's campus are located in the town of Tralee, the administrative capital of County Kerry and Ireland's most popular tourist region. Tralee is surrounded by mountains, rivers, lakes and the wild majestic Atlantic Ocean is nearby offering superb outdoors activities. With a resident population of just 180,000 people welcomes over 2,000,000 visitors every year. It's a busy and fun place to live, work and study.

It's hard to beat Tralee's location, set deep in the foothills of the sprawling Slieve Mish Mountains in Ireland's southwest. At its doorstep lie luxurious sandy beaches, while within its borders is a vibrant town steeped in history. The "old" part of town, areas of which date back to its Norman roots in 1216, are lined with elegant Georgian buildings that transport visitors back to the 18th century. The more modern "Square" features a large open space and shops that lend a cosmopolitan feel.

Tralee has a rich cultural environment, home to the Siamsa Tire, Ireland's national folk theatre, an international film festival & the nearby Dingle Animation festival.

From Tralee, it's easy to get to the nearby town of Dingle which is a hugely popular tourist destination. Each year, Dingle hosts Ireland's leading 'Other Voices' live music series which focuses mainly on alternative music from Irish and international artists. Tralee's sister town Killarney, arguably Ireland's tourist capital, is just a few minutes away by regular

bus. Killarney is home to St Mary's Cathedral, Ross Castle, Muckross House and Abbey, the Lakes of Killarney, MacGillycuddy Reeks, Purple Mountain, Mangerton Mountain, Paps Mountain, the Gap of Dunloe and Torc Waterfall. With so much to do and easy access to the world-famous Killarney National Park, just about every international student at MTU Kerry Campus will spend lots of time in Killarney.

Local attractions include the Tralee Bay Wetlands Visitor Centre, Omniplex cinema, the Kerry County Museum, the Aqua Dome Leisure Indoor Water world, the historic Blennerville windmill and over 250 shops, cafés and restaurants.

INDUSTRY & ECONOMY

County Kerry is home to large multi-nationals spanning areas such as agricultural, engineering, pharmaceutical, fintech and software/IT. Companies include the world's largest food ingredients company, Kerry Group, dairy engineering company Dairymaster and FEXCO, a financial technology service companies. Liebherr Cranes also have a manufacturing facility located nearby in Killarney.

ACCOMMODATION

Tralee has lots of high quality, affordable accommodation for students. Usually international students live in an apartment (often in a private room with private bathroom) typically with 2 other students. All apartments have a well equipped kitchen and living room often with free WiFi included.

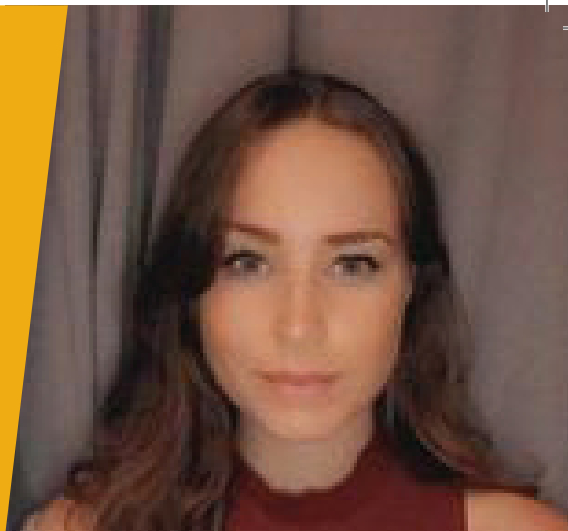
